No low income housing

I own my own home but I know many are unable to find affordable housing here

The current low/affordable income housing is not available to all people. You need a high credit score to get into the affordable housing. Many do not own their own home due to credit problems and they need to rent but don't qualify to live there. Many of the low income units are filled with people that moved to Frankfort when the housing by the Shell Station opened up......in other words the new units by the Shell do not house many local working and/or low income people. I hope we don't build more housing near Gateway Hill that does not accommodate people already living here that are in need of quality housing.

Frankfort is turning into just another tourist town with junky stores and and no room for locals, everything about it is geared to tourists.

I want Frankfort to grow on all economic levels as well as lower income. We need a middle class and more stable yearly employment paying enough to live on and grow a family. Child care so that working parents can have safe adequate and secure child care.

We need good paying job opportunities for young families. As a water community, we don't have a modern boatyard/marina. There is an opportunity for year around employment. The next useful facilities are in Onekama and Northport.

Tiny homes for seniors and people who are going to retire who have only social security, widows, etc.

We bought our home in Benzonia because homes in Frankfort were too expensive. As wife to a business owner, I heard the problems of finding enough employees and know this problem is perpetuated by many things including lack of housing in the area. I believe there are many in the community that are willing to help solve this problem in any way - small or large - that they can. I teach in Frankfort and affordable housing is difficult for families to find. Jobs that pay enough for families to afford a home are a major shortage as well.

The purpose of this survey should be beneficial to the community. However, it also could be slanted toward those with the intentions of developing subsidized housing - to their profit. Frankfort needs no more housing of this type.

Please: Lower year round expenses for city year round residents. High taxes, water/sewer etc. Just my humble opinion, no offense

#9: Tiny house. #11: I love living and working in Frankfort. #12: I would like to attend meetings on housing. I am very interested in this. I would love to own a small house in Frankfort. (I have contact info @ City Hall - Shannon)

No more subsidized housing. It encourages people not to work and to depend on those who do work. I have often worked more than one job but have never asked for others to work so that I could be housed! Those who built/own these buildings are the winners of a guarantee return from those of us who work and pay taxes. Stop dependence!

#11: I would love to live here to rent. #12:We have low income housing and those people don't work. We need affordable rental apartments and homes for the middle to low who work. 1 subsidized for seniors, 1 complete for moderate income people who work & live in Frankfort. What would happen if funds were available to buy and then fix up (perhaps as a h. school lab school - sell and use profits to buy another house(s) to re-fix etc???

Elberta & east of Frankfort should be developed with smallish single family homes & duplexes Allowing absentee owners to operate short term rentals in a residential zone violates the rights of neighbors. The children of visitors here for a week or less won't be wanting to work here. This should only be allowed in commercial zones. Rather than the city investing in boondoggles like the proposed community resource center, it should develop housing for its workers before Frankfort isn't a destination anymore.

Provide landlords with a list of approved renters that have been vetted by the housing council Affordable housing should be a priority in order to attract and keep young people and families in the area for employment and a growing community

#11: No, but only because I work in Benzonia & would prefer to live close. #12: There seems to be a lot of public misunderstanding about what "affordable housing" is, and the affect it will have on neighborhoods. There is a misconception that such residents would be undesireables. Maybe some form of awareness campaign/ads to show who would benefit, that being poor does not make you riff-raff.

#11: Yes and no, I love Frankfort, I just wish you didn't have to pay for water. #12:

Beulah/Benzonia/Honor area, as well as the Frankfort community, need more affordable housing. Even in one of the areas, it would greatly help! A single mom doesn't have a lot of options.

No more low income housing

#11: Too many tourists. #12: Don't want or need any low income housing

No affordable housing - do not want in this area too many offered already

#9: single family homes priced \$150-200,000. #11: No. Frankfort (city) taxes are too high and too far of a commute to Traverse City. #12: As a realtor, it is very difficult finding housing for young professionals/working individuals to purchase in the \$150,000 - \$200,000 price range. I have a teacher & her husband qualified for up to \$170,000 and they can't find anything in Frankfort in their price range. As a result, they are now considering Interlochen.

#11: Frankfort is a great community for families, but if something isn't done to have families here, this area will die. #12: Daycare & jobs (other than seasonal jobs) are needed here and in Benzie Co. More affordable housing. Maybe the city could come up with incentives to help start daycares. I believe the city should work to find year round business to help families live here. Not just for the tourists. Also some way to cap the price of housing. 500 thousand to a million is ridiculous! As a single mom, owning my own home would be great. I would love to have a stable environment for my kids.

Reg. short term rentals, limit short term rentals to one property per owner. (No one person or bus. owning multiple props), provide incentives for year round rentals.

We need more childcare options

#11: Yes, but NOT during the summer months. #12: Consider small housing needs in local zoning, low to moderate income housing in the county, affordable childcare for young families just starting out in Benzie County, promote industry and try to get more in the area, make it affordable for people to shop in the county rather than running to TC-Manistee or Cadillac, ensure that all areas of Benzie County can have access to natural gas, look at min wage pay in the county, if tourism is going to be our main industry, then promote it, senior housing needs for retirees.

More permanent rentals vs short term

#11: Too busy with tourists season

Affordable childcare is important along with affordable housing to encourage young families to choose this area as home.

#11: Own my own home. #12: There are so many single mothers in Benzonia and a lot of the surrounding counties it's hard to work and afford daycare. There are also no daycares, or at the very least, they have been on the decline.

#9: With 20 acres. #11: Not in town, too much for water & sewer bill

#11: Too many sex offenders, a lot of drugs in the community

More rental houses with doable rent for someone making \$30,000/year or less

#9: Single family homes in any price range

More affordable housing options for those who don't have great paying jobs. It's sad that if you are willing to work, you can't get assistance. But the welfare apartments across from Graceland, they don't work and get all the help they want.

There is a great need for affordable housing in this area. It is very scary having to always worry and wonder what will happen if lose my current living situation and just not having any options to consider moving to different housing.

#11: Yes, as this is where my children go to school and where I work.

#11: No, own home

Affordable housing must be available year-round, not just off-season

#11: Maybe not sure

#11: No, I own a home in Benzonia

More rent to owns or cheaper rentals

#11: Yes, it's a beautiful area, however it's just too expensive to live here. All around cost of living is too high. #12: Rent, utilities and property tax all need to be lowered. Most people in this area work at minimum wage jobs and rely on government funding to get by costing everybody more money in taxes and that tax money is not being spent wisely. It's sad when even making \$12.00/hour I cannot afford to live on my own. I need a roommate to help foot the bills.

#11: No, already own

#11: No, too many greedy city people. #12: Quit passing zoning ordinances that keep you from building to your wants and needs.

#11: Country is better, land is great to have no water bill, well water better

#11: No, my childcare and living situation is in same county now

Not everyone likes to live in an apartment

Bring in more low income housing, higher paying jobs

One problem I see, is homeowners rent home for winter season, then expect these families to move out for summer tourist to rent their homes at a high price. This leaves many families scrambling for housing. This is so wrong. Should be some sort of ordinance against that. Also better wages for all of us that stay year around. Larger daycare center to accommodate the families that stay here to work. If we had a larger daycare center to accommodate families in need, this would also create some jobs for our community that would be year-round positions. Have hours in daycare to accommodate those who work later hours. Also encourage families to apply for the Michigan Subsidy for daycare to help offset their cost for childcare expenses.

#10: Lack of employment opportunities: Year-round. #12: Frankfort relies on tourism for a great part of its economy. This is a part-time employment issue for many people. Tourism isn't going to happen in great numbers due to the winter weather. Bringing full time employment to the town would be very beneficial for housing costs.

As mentioned, I think it is very hard for young families (in their 20s & 30s) to buy in downtown Frankfort. I know of 3 families on our street who bought from family members or would not have been able. On Forest & Leelanau, only about 1 in 10 houses are year-round residents, which is very sad. Other smaller houses are being snatched up as seasonal, and those are the ones young families could actually afford. Sad.

#11: Close to work, great town. #12: Available, affordable housing is very hard to come by for working people especially on 1 income or retired single person.

#9: Moderate income...too many low income exist already. #12: Tax break to offer year-round rentals. (higher tax bracket for people that do summer rentals??)

#11: I prefer living in Bear Lake

#11: I prefer a non-tourist town

#9: Other, smaller minimum size. #11: Less gas expense and time. #12: Smaller land splits, smaller square foot for house.

#9: Need affordable housing for area wage. #12: We need affordable housing in this area to attract workers for area wages.

Affordable 3 bedroom, 2 bath houses, modern & efficient would be great!

Please do not bus people in from city's downstate! (You know what I mean)

Pay higher wages to workers

#9: Other: Homes \$150,000-\$200,000. #12: We need houses that younger families can afford! Enough million \$ cottage.

#11: I live on East Bay on Old Mission Peninsula

#11: Yes, great place to bring up a family. #12: No low income housing, please!

When I first moved here, it was next to impossible to find a home to rent during the school year & there was no year-round rental available.

#11: No, Frankfort is gorgeous as it is. #12: We love our town as it is.

#11: No, just bought a home 2 years ago

#9: Subsidized housing for low to moderate... NO!!!

#9: Other: Single family homes for \$130k - \$200k. #11: No, my family is content with our home.

#12: It seems like we already have a large quantity of low-income/subsidized housing available here compared to other communities that are similar to Frankfort.
